2024 Raffle Quilt: We have the 2024 Raffle quilt tickets available. As it is not required to sell these tickets it is highly encouraged for each member to try to sell at least \$20.00 in tickets. In order for our guild to continue to get supplies for making quilts for One Place and our other charities we need to have money coming in. The Raffle Quilt is a great way to do this. We also would like to have classes available for our members to take at a low cost, however to bring in teachers we need funds to pay for them, which circles back to selling raffle quilt tickets.

If you say "I don't know anyone or I don't like approaching people" I completely understand. I can talk to a tree, but not everyone is like me. So we plan to help throughout the year. We will be posting in the public Carolina Pine Needle Quilters Guild Facebook page so you can just click on share and see if anyone comments they'd like tickets.

I have envelopes I bring to the meeting with your name on it. Inside is a photo of the quilt and on the back is all the information you need to help with any questions you may get. There are tickets inside as well. I have stapled 3 together which is a value of \$5.00. There are 4 of these sets. You do not need to pay for these upfront at all! GUILD CLASS FOR 2024

The members of the guild have requested instructional classes. The CPNQG has been able to lock on Judy Rains, instructor of paper piecing technique. So mark your calendar for Saturday, March 16, 2024.

Judy Rains, authorized teacher for BeColourful Quilts, has offered to come to our guild and teach us a paper piece pattern by Jacqueline De Jonge, titled "Starlight". Judy will provide kits for this 20 x 20-inch pattern. The kit will provide all needed fabrics to complete the top, and will include quilt pattern and foundation papers. Class size will be limited to 20, with sign ups and payment for the class starting at first guild meeting on January 2024. The kit fee will be \$40 per student.

Judy Rains will also provide our guild with a trunk show at our March 12 th guild meeting. This is such a great opportunity for all members to partake of Judy's knowledge, be it at the trunk show, or the classroom, or both.

With everyone's participation, this Community Mission will be accomplished. There are many jobs to focus on that day. You can iron, pin, or sew stockings. So grab a Lunch and come join in the fun.

Sue Miller will bring fabric and patterns to December meeting for any other members who wish to precut stockings for our January sew day.

If you wish to donate fabric, please bring any fleece fabric (white, beige, red or green), Christmas fabric and any extra ½ inch ribbon to Sew Day.

If you wish donate items for the stockings, they too will also be accepted on January 15th . These items

include: Small bottles (hotel sample size) of shampoo, conditioner, lotion, and body wash. Tubes of toothpaste along with a new toothbrush, comb, hair brush, and small packages of Kleenex are greatly appreciated. Other items include deodorant, shaving cream, pens, stationary, large print word find
