2024 Raffle Quilt: We have the 2024 Raffle quilt tickets available. It is highly encouraged for each member to try to sell at least \$20.00 in tickets. In order for our guild to continue to get supplies for making quilts for One Place and our other charities we need to have money coming in. The Raffle Quilt is a great way to do this. We also would like to have classes available for our members to take at a low cost, however to bring in teachers we need funds to pay for them, which circles back to selling raffle quilt tickets.

Jane Mitchell has envelopes she is bringing to the meeting with your name on it. Inside is a photo of the quilt and on the back is all the information you need to help with any questions you may get. There are tickets inside as well. Jane has stapled 3 together which is a value of \$5.00. There are 4 of these sets. You do not need to pay for these upfront at all! Just grab your envelope and carry with you. If someone wants any tickets just collect their money and the stub with their information then turn in at the next guild meeting or contact Jane Mitchell or any board member if you wish to turn in before the meeting date.

Why Does CPNQG Make Quilts for One Place Child Advocacy Center?

One Place Child Advocacy Center helps young victims of child abuse and neglect in Onslow County. Children of ages infant to age 18 go to this facility to receive physical exams, talk to trained counselors and investigators, and start their recovery.

We at Carolina Pine Needle Quilt Guild, since 2010, have been an integral part of this recovery. Every victim of abuse receives a quilt "Stitched With Love" by the CPNQG. The guild has nicknamed them "Portable Hugs".

Our mission as guild members is to share our love of quilting with kids in need who are lonely, hurting or just in need of comfort and Hope during a time of uncertainty. The staff at One Place say the quilts allow children to hold on to the good feelings they experience at the center. It is a reminder for them that people believe in them and advocate for them.

This past year, the Carolina Pine Needle Quilters Guild provided 300 plus quilts to One Place Child Advocacy Center. This is one of our main guild missions.

CLASS FEE: \$20 (SEAT IS RESERVED FOR THE CLASS WITH PAID FEE. FEE IS NONREFUNDABLE) THE CLASS FEE WILL INCLUDE INSTRUCTION ON HOW TO USE THE QUICK CURVE MINI RULER, SEWING CURVED BLOCKS, AND THE TREE LAYOUT. ALL FEES MUST BE PAID BY APRIL 9TH

ITEMS NEEDED TO BRING: YOUR SEWING MACHINE AND CORDS, NEUTRAL PIECING
THREAD AND BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES.
SEW KIND OF WONDERFUL QCR MINI RULER
45 MM ROTARY CUTTER AND SMALL CUTTING MAT

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

PLEASE, IF POSSIBLE, HAVE ALL THESE PIECES PRECUT BEFORE THE DAY OF CLASS

TREE: CUT (38) 5" SQUARES. THIS IS FOR THE MAIN BODY OF THE TREE. VARIETY OF GREEN SHADES IS GOOD.

STAR: (2) 5 ½" SQUARES OF GOLD FABRIC. YOU CAN USE ANY COLOR OF YOUR CHOICE.

BACKGROUND FABRIC: (2) 4" BY 7 ½ " PIECES

(9) 4 ½" BY 7 ½"; PIECES (2) 11 INCH SQUARES,

(2) 4 BY 11 INCH RECTANGLES, (2) 7 1½ INCH SQUARES,

AND (2) 2 ½ BY 5 INCH RECTANGLES.

TREE TRUNK: CUT (2) 2 ½" BY 5 INCH BROWN PIECES.



If you would like to put a kit together, please reach out and one can be brought to a meeting – or if you are in Jacksonville stop by All About Quilting (910–577–9200) and pick one up. Calling first to make sure one is available would be good. If you have a pattern and you need more fabric to complete it – we have lots of fat quarters, 5" squares and 2 1/2" squares available. Trying to use larger pieces of fabric for backs, some larger pieces for sashing and borders on completed tops that need to be a little bigger. We have some blocks that are complete but need to be made into quilt tops.

We love making veterans smile and thank you all so much for your help in making that happen.


